HART TENNIS COMPLEX: The home courts for the Lions, Hart Tennis Complex, seats 200. The stadium is located on the north edge of campus, parallel to Mears Stadium.

PRESS CREDENTIALS: While press passes are not necessary to cover Mars Hill tennis matches, the sports information department requests that you notify them of your intention to cover a game at least 48 hours in advance.

PHOTOGRAPHY: Photo passes are not necessary, but the sports information department requests that you notify them of your intentions at least 48 hours in advance. It will be expected that photographers are aware of NCAA rules regarding photography areas and that those rules are abided.

MEDIA PARKING: Parking is limited and is located across from Chambers Gymnasium.

MEDIA SERVICES: Complete game statistics and play-by-play will be distributed to the media following each home game.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS: Post-game interviews with head coach Tom Schrecengost will be allowed following the NCAA mandated 10 minute cooling off period. No interviews will be allowed in the locker room, but players will be retrieved by the sports information director as needed.

NON-GAME DAY INTERVIEWS: Requests for interviews with coaches or players on non-game days should be coordinated through the sports information office. Arrangements must be made at least one day in advance.

Dan Lunsford President

Dr. Dan Lunsford is the President of Mars Hill College. Dr. Lunsford has served as the Dean of the School of Education and Leadership since October 1998. He took over the presidency at Mars Hill College on January 24, 2002.

Dan Lunsford has enjoyed a highly successful career as an educator and administrator. Since accepting the position of Dean of the School of Education and Leadership at Mars Hill College in October, 1998, he has helped to secure grants for programs for the Adult ACCESS Teacher Education Program and English as a Second Language. During this period, the Teacher Education Program was re-credited, received high marks on the N.C. Education Performance Report, and a Special Education Preparation Program was begun. From 1990-1998, Lunsford served as Superintendent of Henderson County Public Schools. During his tenure there, he was responsible for the administrative management of the second largest

school system in Western North Carolina with a membership of 11,300+ students, 1,500+ employees and a budget of more than \$57 million. From 1983-1990, Lunsford served as Superintendent of Orange County Schools. He has also worked as an Associate Superintendent for Instruction, Assistant Superintendent for Instruction, Director of Instruction and Elementary Principal - all within the Orange County School District. He began his career in 1969 as a sixth-grade teacher at Holloway Street School in Durham, NC.

Dan Lunsford is an alumnus of Mars Hill College, graduating in 1969 with a B.A. in Elementary Education. He completed his M.Ed. in School Administration and Supervision in 1971 from UNC-Chapel Hill, and went on to earn his Ed.D. in School Administration and Supervision from UNC-Chapel Hill in 1980. He participated in postdoctoral study at Vanderbilt University in 1984 and the Superintendents' Executive Program at the UNC-Chapel Hill Institute of Government in 1989. Lunsford maintains strong involvement in community and professional organizations. He and his wife, Beverly, have one son, and they live in the Mars Hill Community.



David Riggins Athletic Director

David Riggins is beginning his eighteenth year at Mars Hill College. He assumed the athletic director's duties on September 1, 1998, after serving as the assistant athletic director at Mars Hill since 1993.

Riggins is the winningest head men's basketball coach in school history. He accumulated 431 victories as a head high school and collegiate coach. His high school teams collected eight conference championships and three State Championships while making nine playoff appearances. He guided his Mars Hill teams to three post-season appearances.

Coach Riggins is active in community life. He is a member of Woodland Hills Baptist Church and is a member of the Weaverville Rotary Club. Riggins has been actively involved in NCAA Committee work having served on the Regional Advisory Council and the NCAA task force regarding membership review. He currently serves on the NCAA Championship Committee and the NCAA Playing Rules Committee. In addition, Riggins is the Chair of the SAC Athletic Director's Council.

Coach Riggins played basketball in college at Francis Marion University before receiving both his bachelor's degree (1974) and master's degree (1980) from the University of South Carolina.

Coach Riggins and his wife Rita have two sons, Chase (19) and Kyle (16) and they reside in Weaverville.

WOMEN'S TENNIS OUTLOOK



The 2004 Mars Hill Lady Lions' tennis team will be very young, but will boast the most ability it has had in four years. The future is bright with the team consisting of four freshman and five sophomores.

The team will be led by two returning sophomores, Jessica McFarland and Jenny Rogers. These two manned the #1 and #2 singles positions on the team last spring and will look to use that experience to their benefit this season.

The key to the team's success will be the development of three freshman, all of whom were ranked in the top 75 players in North Carolina prior to coming to Mars Hill. Nancie Gruber was ranked in the top 15 players in the State and played her high school tennis at nearby East Henderson High School. Whitney Stroud (top 40 ranked player in North Carolina) is from Spindale and Maranda Dellinger (top 75 ranked in North Carolina) is from Elkin. How these three fare in their first seasons of collegiate competition will to a great extent determine overall team success.

This year's team also includes four walk-on players who all look to be significant contributors. Rachel Barcio, Jessica Haines, Rebekah Bunch, and Helen Brown will all compete for a spot in the doubles and singles line-ups and provide more depth to the squad than it has had in some time.

With no juniors or seniors on the team, the squad will experience some growing pains that come with youth. The level of talent is much better than past years and with hard work results should be much improved.

MEN'S TENNIS OUTLOOK



This year's men's tennis team will mix a blend of youth and experience as it looks to improve on its sixth place SAC finish of a year ago.

The team will be led by senior captain Carlos Bracho who is looking to add another all conference selection to his impressive resume and provide leadership to the younger members of the team.

The two other seniors are Larry Putnam and Brent Propst. North Carolina natives, both have improved their games significantly since their arrival at Mars Hill and will provide invaluable depth and competition at the bottom of the ladder.

Two juniors look to make their mark for Mars Hill this spring. Joel Vanderhorst and Ross Diloreto will look for winning campaigns as they draw on their experience playing at high positions for the Lions the previous two years.

Two freshman, Bobby Roddy and Steven Arnall, will play significant roles on this year's team. The two were ranked USTA players in Florida and Georgia, respectively. The talent is present for both players. The key to their success will be their willingness to work hard and continue to mature in the mental and emotional aspects of the game.

A talented newcomer begins his first semester with the Lions this spring. Diego Rodriguez De Marzo of Lima, Peru, will bring significant tournament experience to the team and is expected to play a high position in both singles and doubles.

The team has more depth and talent throughout the lineup than in quite some time. How much the younger players mature and the experienced players continue to improve will determine the level of success the team sees in the ultra competitive South Atlantic Conference.

Mars Hill College emphasizes the importance of wellness in each of its 16 intercollegiate athletic teams, seeing to it that each team has what it needs to compete successfully at the NCAA Division II level. An integral part of that is the Athletic Training Staff, whose responsibilities include, administering first aid to injured athletes and assisting with the care and treatment of those injuries sustained in athletics competition. In addition, the Student Athletic Trainers work in the training room, aiding in the prevention of athletics injuries, implementing rehabilitation protocols and performing associated record keeping.

The Athletic Training Major is for the student interested in the professional field of athletic training. The course work, along with the clinical experience is designed to stress theory, along with practical application. The National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA), founded in 1950, certifies athletic trainers. With this professional credential, these athletic trainers are employed by industries, professional sports, sports medicine clinics, hospitals, colleges and universities, and high schools.

THE NATIONAL COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION



All eight South Atlantic Conference institutions became full members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) at the Division II level during the summer of 1993. All conference schools were eligible to compete in the NCAA Division II post-season playoffs beginning during the 1993-94 academic year.

The NCAA is the organization through which the nation's colleges and universities speak and act on athletic matters at the national level. It is a voluntary association of more than 1,000 institutions, conferences, organizations and individuals devoted to the sound administration of intercollegiate athletics.

Through the NCAA member colleges consider any athletic problem that has crossed regional or conference lines and has become national in character. The association strives to maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the educational program.

THE SOUTH ATLANTIC CONFERENCE



Beginning with fall 2003 competition, the South Atlantic Conference will be in its 29th year of athletic tradition and excellence. The conference has enjoyed tremendous success due to dedicated people building a premier athletic conference throughout its history.

The distant forerunner of the South Atlantic Conference was the North State Athletic Conference (NSIAC). The NSIAC was formed when the "Little Six", as it was called, broke from the North Carolina Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in 1930. These charter members included Lenoir-Rhyne College, Atlantic Christian, Catawba College, Guilford College, Elon College, and High Point University.

The North State continued to grow over the next 30 years, adding Western Carolina (1933), East Carolina (1947) and Pfeiffer (1960). A name change became necessary when the league accepted Newberry as its first South Carolina member in 1961. The league took on the name Carolinas Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (CIAC) on May 20th of that year.

The CIAC saw several changes in the following years as East Carolina withdrew from the league in 1962. Appalachian State and Western Carolina followed in 1971 and 1976. All three landed in the Southern Conference.

The South Atlantic Conference was founded in 1975 solely as a football conference. The league received its name from a contest in which Kurt Brenneman of Greensboro, NC became the first to submit the SAC-8 moniker.

The SAC-8 consisted of Carson-Newman College, Catawba College, Elon College, Gardner-Webb University, Lenoir-Rhyne College, Mars Hill College, Newberry College, and Presbyterian College. Dr. Fred Bentley, of Mars Hill College, was named league president for its inaugural year, by a vote of the member institutions.

After the first season of play in the SAC-8, the Bears of Lenoir-Rhyne College captured the first football title.

In 1989, the league's 15th year of operation, the South Atlantic Conference became a comprehensive, all-sports conference. That year the South Atlantic Conference sponsored 10 sports - football, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's soccer, volleyball, men's golf, men's and women's tennis. Later the conference grew to 14 championship sports by adding women's soccer (1990), men's and women's cross country (1993) and women's golf (1999).

The South Atlantic Conference was composed of the same eight member institutions from 1975 until 1988, when Wingate University replaced Newberry College as the eighth member institution. Newberry later rejoined the conference in 1996.

Today the conference is a group of eight church affiliated colleges and universities, similar in size and athletic philosophy. Since becoming eligible for NCAA Division II postseason play in 1993, the league has sent representatives from all of its sponsored sports to NCAA postseason play.

In July of 1998, Tusculum College was admitted as a member of the league. The league membership now includes Carson-Newman in Jefferson City, TN, Catawba College in Salisbury, NC, Lenoir-Rhyne College in Hickory, NC, Mars Hill College in Mars Hill, NC, Newberry College in Newberry, SC, Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC, Tusculum College in Greeneville, TN, and Wingate University in Wingate, NC.
